Parish Bulletin

Our parish by the borders

I'm often asked how big is our parish. We have a lot of people living in our community who were born elsewhere and who have moved here through marriage, work or choice of place to live. Many of the people who were born here are not familiar with all the parish, either. Geographically, the parish encompasses

a large area beginning in the north beyond Coppeen in the townland of Moneygaff West (pronounced Moneygauve); the boundary goes west from there towards the turn for Kilmichael but turns south before that towards Ballineen, via Mallow. Dromfeigh and Cahir and emerges onto the Manch road at the "Idle bridge" and our boundary then turns east before crossing the Bandon river to the townland of Phale (pronounced Vale). The parish boundary then follows the Rossmore Road west of Shanaway and Hollyhill and turns east at Keelvelogue into Carhuvouler. East of Carhuvouler it turns south through Knocks to Lyre Cross and then heads east at the pub through part of Crohane, south of Kilmovlerane towards Ballinascarthy but heads back to include Pedlars Cross before crossing the Bandon-Clonakilty Road to include Tullymurrihy, then north through Cashelmore and Cashelcommons before heading down to the Clon-Bandon Road again (across from the former Hosfords Garden Centre) and

north through Kilcolman and north to the banks of the river Bandon again east of Kilcolman PO, then following the river westward, north of Desert, as far as Bandon Coop where the border turns north again to Teadies Upper and Keelnacrannagh West and on up to Castletown Kenneigh, including all of that townland eastward to its border with Belrose (which is in Murragh). North of Castletown Kenneigh church, the parish boundary includes Garlands, Shanaclough and Moneycrohy, heading east at "Kelly's Cross" along the east side of Moneycrohy and then swinging slightly westward to the Bantry-Cork road where our border swings "west along the road" to include Lackinashinagh and all of Moneygaff West again.

Along the way, our parish shares boundaries with other parishes including Kilmichael, Dunmanway, Kilmeen, Clonakilty, Timoleague, Bandon and Murragh.

Our parish borders date from 1858 when the parish of Enniskeane and Kenneigh was united with the major part of Desertserges parish to become the parish of Enniskeane and Desertserges. This means that the present configuration of our parish is 155 years old this year.

Of course, geographical boundaries do not limit our welcomes!
