Lourdes Pilgrimage and Funds

Next weekend there is a second collection in all churches of the diocese in aid of the Lourdes Pilgrimage Fund.

This collection subsides the Annual Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes (June 11 to 16) for individuals whose health and/or means would otherwise prevent them from travelling to Lourdes. It also subsidises the travel of essential care personnel. It is administered by Canon Jim O'Donovan, The Presbytery, Ballinlough, Cork.

There are three ways in which people may take part in this special annual pilgrimage to the most famous Marian Shrine in the world:-

(a) Sick people who need care. These are always seen as the most important people in Lourdes. Last year, 94 such people from Cork & Ross took part in the pilgrimage. They stay at a specially built hospital near the Grotto in Lourdes and are cared for on a 24-hour basis by a dedicated team of several hundred volunteer doctors, nurses, carers and helpers. The cost of travel to Lourdes for the sick is subsidised by the collection and the cost of renting the hospital is also paid for by the collection.

(b) People who are praying for healing

but are independent. Many people travel to Lourdes to make a pilgrimage for themselves or on behalf of or with a family member or friend. Accommodation is provided at one of the town's many hotels near the Grotto. These pilgrims usually pay their own way but the cost ought never be a barrier to anyone (help is available for anyone who needs it). Places on this part of the pilgrimage can be booked by contacting Joe Walsh Tours at Tel 021-4277959.

(c) Many people travel to help organise the pilgrimage and, especially, to help the sick and those with special needs. Some go as professionals and many more go to help with the many tasks that need to be done in the hospital and in helping the sick take part in the ceremonies. The pilgrimage could not happen without the dedication and care of so many people. Last year, nine young adult helpers from our parish played a big part in the success of the pilgrimage. Others adults from our parish also helped out. The cost of the pilgrimage for the carers is subsidised by the collection.
