#### Discipleship 2016

Last week, an earthquake devastated a large community along the coast of Equador in South America. Several hundred people died; the local airport was closed; hotels were destroyed; homes disappeared. Part of the impact is due to the poverty of that community. They can't afford hi-tech early warning systems and the buildings are badly engineered to survive even the mildest quake.

In an almost neighbouring country, in Los Angeles, they are also used to earth-quakes. But they have learned the lessons of history. Here they have 'quake-proofed' almost all the buildings, they have early warning systems that trigger all kinds of high-tech systems to minimise the loss of life. Yes, they can afford these in LA, but money alone wouldn't make the difference: people have to learn from the past and then plan effective responses for the future.

At a Confirmation lunch during the week I asked the bishop and the other priests if many interested people had attended the Vocations Information Day organised by the diocese for last Sunday. The silence that followed might parallel the news of an impending earthquake! Deep inside, I almost suspected the answer even as I asked the question. There was no potential candidate turned up who wasn't already in contact with the diocese. People expressing an interest in be-

coming a priest for our diocese are now a rarity — and have been for many years now. But we continue to have an Information Day.

We haven't changed anything! We haven't re-engineered how our parishes work or how their need for ministry is provided. In the last ten years in Ireland, the number of priests in active service has declined dramatically due to retirements, deaths and resignations while at the same time the number being ordained has shrunk to a fraction of what it was. But we all know this — bishops, parishioners, sisters, priests — but we only speak of it in whispers.

A recent meeting with their bishop of Limerick parishioners heard people underline the need for new ways of responding to the emerging needs of the local parishes. We have had similar meetings back along in our diocese. Change comes slowly dripping. It is even slower if we look to others to make it happen while the rest of us 'wait and see'. The shake-up being caused by the rapid disappearance of religious brothers and sisters may soon be followed by the disappearance of priests. When that 'quake' hits, it'll will be way too late to ask what to do next or 'why didn't we see it coming?'
