Finance update

A meeting of the Parish Finance Committee was held this week. We reviewed parish funds, projects pending and other works that need to be undertaken to maintain our churches and other buildings. It is apparent that the generosity of parishioners towards the parish funds continues to be evident. This is in spite of the fact that most people have less disposable income in recent years and that some people no longer contribute. Our weekly collections at Mass are at the same level as in 2014.

The ordinary weekly collection which is lodged to the parish account averages €2,234 (this includes envelopes returned from neighbouring parishes). What happens to it? We are obliged by the bishop to contribute 10% to the running costs of the diocese (€223 each week); the diocese also takes another 8% (€179) to provide an income and care for priests who are retired or out of ministry through illness. So we give an average of €412 per week in diocesan levies. That leaves €1,832 per week to pay our parish bills.

The two largest expenses are insurance of \in 201 per week and an average of \in 235 per week for heat and light in the churches – leaving \in 1,396 to meet other bills. With this, we spent an average of \in 174 in 2015 on church requisites (candles, altar breads and wine, missalettes, etc). Wages to employees average, in-

cluding PRSI etc, €324 per week. The remaining €900 or so is used to pay for stationery, postage, bank charges, service charges, property taxes, equipment purchases and supplies, office supplies, grounds maintenance, etc.

Since we completed paying back the bank loan taken out for repairs to Enniskeane Church, we have continued the monthly Building Fund collection. During part of 2014, all of 2015 and so far in 2016, the Building Fund collections have amounted to €96,552. The regular addition of these collections matters and they give us a good start to help pay for the works about to be undertaken at Castletown Church.

The use of the tax-back scheme by so many of the parishioners also makes a big difference. Imagine how many events we would have to organise in order to raise €25,000! That's the average amount of income tax that has been rebated by Revenue in the past two years. This happens when parishioners who use the envelopes allow us to claim back some of the tax they paid. Between the Building Fund in recent years and the rebated tax we have €146,552 accumulated towards the expenditure that we will incur in the coming couple of years.

A sincere thanks to all who are so generous in so many ways. May the Lord reward all who generously share in the work of building up his kingdom
