All Saints Holyday

Tuesday November 1st is the Feast of All Saints and a holy day of obligation. Two Masses in the parish: 10.30am at Enniskeane and at 7.30pm at Enniskeane.

Holy Souls Novena

On the nine days from Nov 2nd to Nov 10th we pray especially at Mass for the Faithful Departed. Scripture says "it is a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead that may be freed from their sins."

On weekdays, the Novena is offered in each church:

10am at Enniskeane;
7.30pm at Castletown Kinneigh
8.30pm at Ahiohill.

The weekend Masses on Sat 6pm and 7.30pm and Sunday 10.30am and 12noon are included in the Novena.

Please enrol your family members and friends using lists and envelopes available in each church and return them to the church. (They can be placed in the collection basket.)

The Novena concludes on Nov 10th at 7.30pm Mass in Enniskeane at which we remember especially those who died in the past year.

Reflection

The beautiful old Irish seanfhócaíl, Ar scaith a chéile a mhaireann na daoine, (it is in the shadow of others that we live) is one that I grew up listening to.

It is just one of many that my beloved Aunt Kally was fond of quoting, and it always had, and continues to have, a deep resonance for me. To me, it is one of the most meaningful and beautiful sayings in a language that is not short on either. It illustrates how interconnected we all are, to our own families of origin and, of course, our wider global Christian family. While those families of origin are moving amongst us in this world, exuberant and full of life, that seanfhócaíl can give us a wonderful warm sense of belonging, place, care and support.

When they have moved on to their eternal realm, it takes on even more significance, for me anyway.

In my case, Kally's shadow, and that of my wider family, of passing on the faith, trying to be a good example, instilling good values, being generous and decent and kind, was a bright one, and anytime feelings of missing them all threaten to overwhelm, I breathe and thank God that I had them. I learned from them. I am of them. I am truly blessed. They have not left me, they have just caught the earlier train in the great journey of life and we will all rejoice at our final destination.
