A Year of Hope ahead

The past year has seen extraordinary events across the world. There's a been a mix of tragedies, natural disasters, political surprises, Brexit, wars and some inspiring initiatives.

Ireland has marked the centenary of 1916 with a balanced commemoration of the events in Dublin a century ago.

Locally, our parish has had several milestones, too. We have had the highest number of funerals in one year for a long time (44 this year, compared with 29 last year). So we are particularly conscious of the families among us for whom this time of year has a particular sadness this year. Our parish has also rallied around in a Christ-like and sincere way in support of all those who have been bereaved.

During the year, we have also had the highest number, for a long time, of Station Masses celebrated across the parish in people's home. Sincere thanks to all who have welcomed the Lord into the their homes – along with neighbours and friends.

The number of marriages celebrated in our parish churches was seven this year and eleven last year. However, we know that other parishioners celebrated their marriage in other parishes during the year and we wish them all every blessing.

Many families are celebrating the birth

of children in the past year and we have welcomed 43 children into the Christian family through Baptism in our parish. (We had 41 baptisms last year and 55 the previous year.)

Castletown Church works

During 2017 we will be carried out significant works at St. Joseph's Church, Castletown Kinneigh. Part will involve the installation of a completely new heating system and this work will commence on Jan 9th.

This means that the church will be closed for the following three weekends. The 10.30am Sunday Mass will instead be celebrated at Enniskeane Church. Please note that the rotas for all the ministries will apply to the Mass in Enniskeane i.e. the altar servers, gifts bearers, Prayer readers, Minsters of the Word, Ministers of the Eucharist, collectors, etc will all serve their usual part at the Mass in Enniskeane.

Jan 6th Holy Day

Friday Jan 6th is the Feast of the Epiphany and a Holy Day of Obligation. Masses will be celebrated in Enniskeane Church at 10.30am and at 7.30pm.
