Is it your turn?

The term of office of our current Parish Assembly is up shortly. It is the policy of the diocese that the membership of the assembly is renewed every three years.

This will happen at all Masses in the parish on the weekeknd of April 21st/22nd. Nomination papers with a space for two names will be distributed.

On the weekend before that (i.e. next weekend) members of the present assembly will speak for a few minutes about the parish assembly, the parish and their role in it.

Who may be a member?

The current Parish Assembly has over 50 members who represent a wide age group (all over 18) and bring a wide range of ideas and talents to the mix.

Members who have served one term of three years may be renominated for a second consecutive term.

The rest of the assembly will be made up of people who accept the nomination.

People may nominate themselves to serve.

People may also nominate others who they think would have a contribution to make to our parish in this role for the next three years.

There will a short training programme offered to all members of the new assembly.

How does the Assembly work?

It fulfils its mission in the parish in partnership with the parish priest and in partnership with the people of the parish.

It reflects and talks about issues that arise throughout the year -- and tasks that repeat each year.

It may propose changes and it may suggest new initiatives.

These are considered by the whole assembly and it aims to reach a consensus about the way forward - in conjunction with the parish priest.

One of the working groups may take responsibility for ensuring that a project is seen through - or it may involve the whole assembly and people who are not in the assembly.

Often, an initiative may be got off the ground by the parish assembly but it can take on a life of its own then.

Structure

The current parish assembly has four working subgroups. Each has its own chairperson and secretary.

The assembly overall has a chairperson, deputy chairperson and secretary who guide the overall meetings and planning of the assembly.
