

Stations of the Cross - Artwork Challenge

As part of our Parish Holy Week Celebrations this year, we are setting an Artwork Challenge. All Children and Young people (the young at heart are also welcome to take part!) are invited to draw/create/colour one of the 14 Stations of the Cross and send a picture of them to us. The best and most original entries will be used during our online Parish celebration of the Stations of the Cross on Good Friday and also receive an Easter Egg.

- Younger children and infants are invited to pick a station and colour in a pre-printed sheet (there is a link to some options available on the parish website www.enniskeaneparish.ie).
- Older children are asked to draw/paint/re-create a station of their choice.
- Teens/Young people may like to reflect on what a particular station means to them, or how it could be linked to our lives today and draw/paint/create an interpretation of the station. (Think about what the way of the cross would look like during our lifetime, with our current global concerns)
- Adults are also encouraged to draw/sketch/paint/create an image to represent a station of the cross.
