A Summer of hope and gratitude

We all hope that by the time the next newsletter is printed that the Coronavirus and its restrictions will be moving into a chapter of history. But we have learned to be cautious too. Hence, we live with hope.

We've learned a lot during the past year. In our parish, the greatest light has been the kindness and goodness of so many people. With so much pressure on everyone, together we kept the life in our parish and we reached out to one another and also made new friends. This was only possible because so many people came forward to help and so many who were already in different ministries and leadership roles did even more. Thank you.

Unfortunately, the restrictions have weakened our connections with schools and our young people whose sacrament days were postponed. We hope to reconnect with them all in the autumn.

As a diocese, one of the key learnings from the pandemic is how vulnerable our parish systems became. When people over 70 were cocooned we realised that many of our priests are included in that category.

We have 11 priests in the diocese who are under 50 years of age. Three of these are on temporary assignment from other places.

With restrictions on how many can attend church for Sunday Mass, the pandemic has forced us to recognise what we'd rather not see: we do not have enough priests to provide Mass in every church and in every parish.

In our local area in recent years we have worked with the priests of four parishes to slightly reduce the number of summer Masses and have priests say Mass in more than one parish. This was the only way priests could get time for a break. But it's a lot harder to reduce the number of Masses for the summer this year.

In Enniskeane Parish, as a result, there will be one weekend when there won't be a Mass in the parish. That's the weekend of Sat/Sun July 17/18th. Weekday Mass will not be celebrated from July 12th – 23rd. Neighbouring churches do not have space to accommodate more people so we ask people, when possible, to connect with Mass online and on the TV.

Funeral Masses during that period will be offered by neighbouring priests.
