### Novena of Masses

The concluding Mass of the Novena (Wed 10th at 7.30pm) will include prayers for people whose funerals took place in our parish since the last Novena. During this mass, a special candle (provided by the parish) bearing the deceased person's name will be lit for each person. After the mass, the families are welcome to take this candle home and to light it at home during November In our prayer together, may all our departed loved ones grow towards the light of Christ's resurrection.

### Reopening of our three Churches

This weekend marks the first weekend, after so long, that we are having a regular weekend mass in each of our three Churches in the parish – long may it continue! This would not be possible without so much work by so many people. Thanks to everyone who answered the call to serve, whether you are a returning stalwart, a new recruit or a

constant companion we are grateful for you. Thanks also to the people throughout the parish who have undertaken the work of putting together all the rotas. We would still be delighted to add new members to any of these rotas so if you have not vet volunteered for a role vou can be added in at any stage. Contact the parish assembly or the parish office at any time, in particular we need collectors for Enniskeane Church (please call to sacristy) Similarly, there has been a great response to the young people's rotas. These young people are the future of our community, and it is very important to us that they are involved in parish life. There is still room on the rotas, so it is not too late to come forward.

## **Funeral Ministry**

How funerals were conducted was changed significantly during the pandemic and this led to priests and parishioners holding a review of the current situation and requesting some guidance on how to go forward.

The principal outcome of this review is a renewed emphasis on funeral ministry as belonging to the whole parish. Ministry, including prayers and support, for bereaved families in parishes at the time of a funeral is to be provided by members of a parish team rather than just the clergy alone. Funeral teams were trained and introduced in many parishes a number of years ago. The new policy document on funerals is available on corkandross.org.
