Papal messages

Every so often the news media gives a break from Covid news and picks on something or someone else for a change! If a message from another source is potentially controversial, it'll make it's way onto the front page! This was the case with Pope Francis in the past week.

On Wednesday, he addressed a gathering at his general audience in the sixth of a series of talks he is giving each week on St. Joseph. This week, he encouraged people to be like St. Joseph and overcome any fear or hesitation couples might have about becoming parents. He highlighted the difficulties many couples have in becoming parents. He also pointed to the many children in the world who have no one to look after them and asked that more support be given to adoptive couples. "I pray that

no one will feel deprived of the bond of paternal love".

He said our world needs young people and they need generous parents to mind and care for them.

Pope Francis concluded his text with this prayer:-

I pray that no one will feel deprived of the bond of paternal love. And those who are orphaned, may they go forward without feeling abandoned. May Saint Joseph protect, and give his help to orphans; and may he intercede for couples who wish to have a child. Let us pray for this together:

Saint Joseph,
you who loved Jesus with fatherly love,
be close to the many children who have no family
and who long for a daddy and mommy.
Support the couples who are unable to have children,
help them to discover, through this suffering, a greater plan.
Make sure that no one lacks a home, a bond,
a person to take care of him or her;
and heal the selfishness of those who close themselves off from life,
that they may open their hearts to love.
